

Boater's Guide to Whitchurch (Shropshire) 16Apr2023

About Whitchurch

Whitchurch is the oldest continually inhabited town in Shropshire, having been established in about 70AD by the Romans, who built a fort there. Its Roman name was Mediolanum, meaning "town in mid-plain", as it was midway between Chester (Deva) and Wroxeter (Viroconium), being a day's march from either. The name Whitchurch is derived from "White Church", which referred to a Norman white stone church on the site where St Alkmunds stands today.

Whitchurch received its first market charter market c1190 and a Friday morning market is still held. The town has plenty of character, many examples of interesting architecture to look at, and lots of independent shops. There's another market on the 1st Sat of the month.



There are 6 supermarkets (Aldi, Iceland, Lidl, Morrisons, Sainsburys / Argos, and Tesco), a TSB bank, a baker, 2 butchers, a zero-waste shop, a hardware shop (Colour Supplies), 9 pubs, restaurants, cafes, fast food / takeaway shops, 3 fish and chip shops and much more.

Walking into Town (About 0.7 miles / 1.2 km (20-25 mins) from the Whitchurch Arm)

Head straight on, going under an old bridge and then a more modern one with painted murals. Follow the path past some picnic tables, cross Greenfields Way, and go down the steps or slope on the other side. Follow the path through Whitchurch Waterways Country Park until you emerge at a mini-roundabout with Jubilee Park in front of you. Cross the road, go through the car park, and turn left to follow the path through the park past the children's playground and the bandstand. Exit the park down an alleyway on the left, passing the Thai restaurant (an ex-canal warehouse), on your right. At the end of the alleyway turn left into Mill St, and continue straight on across the pedestrian crossing and through a pedestrian precinct (The Bull Ring) to arrive at the bottom end of the High Street.

Go up the steps at the end of the arm, turn right and immediately right again to cross Chemistry Bridge (the old canal bridge), turn left onto Chemistry, continue across the mini-roundabout and along Smallbrook Road to the next mini-roundabout where you will see Jubilee Park on your right. Continue up Sherrymill Hill, turn left at the mini-roundabout at the top, then right at the next mini-roundabout to arrive at the top of the High Street.

Bus Into Town

The Whitchurch Town Circular bus (205) stops near to the end of the Whitchurch Arm on the other side of Chemistry (adjacent to its junction with Bathfields Crescent) and goes to the town centre – this bus runs Mon-Sat only, daytime only, approx every 30 mins. Markets

Every Friday 0730 - 1230 inside and outside the Civic Centre and Market Hall

The first Saturday of every month 1000 - 1600 (except January) in the High Street and the Bullring

Where's the nearest Pub ?

There is no pub nearer than the town centre, but once you get there you will be spoilt for choice. You could also take a canalside walk (around 40 mins) to the Horse and Jockey at Grindley Brook - cross the lift bridge where the Whitchurch Arm joins the main line of the canal, turn right and when you reach the locks, go through a gap in the hedge between locks 5 and 6 (at the Texaco service station) and cross the A41.

Where's the nearest Pint of Milk if you're tied on the Whitchurch Arm ?

Morrisons in Wrexham Road (around 12 mins slightly hilly walk). Go up the steps at the end of the arm, turn right and immediately right again to cross Chemistry Bridge (the old canal bridge) then turn left onto Chemistry. Turn right onto Thompson Drive and go up the hill. At the T junction turn left onto Wrexham Road and continue until you see Morrisons on your left.

Aldi or Esso service station shop on the Whitchurch By-Pass (around 8 mins flat walk, but it's a bit tricky for pedestrians to walk into the service area - take care !). Go up the steps at the end of the arm, turn right and immediately right again to cross Chemistry Bridge (the old canal bridge) then turn right onto Chemistry. At the T junction turn right and you will see both just before the roundabout.

Trains from Whitchurch Station (about 1.2 miles / 2km from the end of the Whitchurch Arm)

Whitchurch station is unmanned – you buy your ticket from a ticket machine or on board the train. There are trains to Wrenbury, Nantwich and Crewe (16 - 25 mins), Shrewsbury (16 - 30 mins), Manchester Picadilly (60 - 80mins) and South Wales. Buses From Whitchurch

From Whitchurch Bus Station (outside Tesco's) there are buses to Chester (41 / 41A), Wrexham (146 / x46) and Shrewsbury (511 / 512). Checking times is advised, as not all are frequent.

Taxis (in order of distance from the Whitchurch Arm)

The free car park off Meadowcroft may be a useful pick up / drop off point. To get to it from the end of the Whitchurch Arm, head straight on, go under 2 bridges, then up a slope on your right. Here are some taxis near the Whitchurch Arm :

Location of Nearest Road Access for the Whitchurch Arm

The old bridge at the end of the Whitchurch Arm (where it stops dead) is Chemistry Bridge, Chemistry, Whitchurch, Shropshire SY13 1BZ and has road access on top. This bridge is at the eastern end of the Whitchurch Arm of the Llangollen Canal.
